

Dear Survey Reader:

Enclosed are the results from our survey of residential and commercial solid waste rates and services in the cities within Los Angeles County.

INTERPRETING RESULTS

In order to assist you in interpreting the results, we have identified certain special service features that affect the cost of service, such as the method of collection and types of diversion programs.

Please note that there are other operating characteristics that affect the cost of service that our survey did not address, such as route density, disposal volumes, revenue sharing arrangements for recyclable material sales, fees retained by cities, pricing decisions in regard to rate structures, impacts related to SB 1383 requirements, as well as other factors. There may also be special services provided to some cities at no additional charge to the ratepayers, such as bulky item pick-up, household hazardous waste collection, and city-wide clean-up days. These characteristics can have a significant impact on the cost of solid waste collection services and may vary by city. For the above reasons, a city with a relatively low rate may not be "getting a better deal." The low rate may mean that certain operating characteristics, unique to that particular community, may enable the hauler to provide service at a lower cost, or that pricing and service decisions have kept the rates low. Conversely, cities with a relatively high rate may have certain attributes or services that cause the cost of solid waste collection services to be higher.

SURVEY PROCESS AND LIMITATIONS

The survey was performed by HF&H Consultants on behalf of the Los Angeles County Public Works Department. HF&H Consultants is a firm that specializes in the areas of recycling, solid waste, and water/wastewater management services. The survey information was provided by the cities and/or haulers during telephone interviews, emails, and other written correspondences, summarized and sent to each survey participant for confirmation.



The information contained in the enclosed exhibits is based on the data reported by the participating cities and/or haulers for rates in effect as of July 1, 2021. We have not independently verified the submitted data.








Residential Collection Service Providers



Residential Refuse Rates by Container Size (1)










Are Any of the Commercial Rates Bundled?

Commercial Refuse Rates by Container Size (1)




How is Commercial Food Waste Collected?



How Does Your City Define Multi-Family Properties In Terms Of Number Of Units (Or More)?*




Does Multi-Family Service Fall Under the Residential Contract or Commercial Contract?


Do Multi-Family Customers With Bin Service Pay the Same Rate as Commercial Bin Customers, or Do They Have Unique Multi-Family Rates?

Does Your City Offer an Organics Program for Multi-Family Properties?




