





ORGANIC WASTE RECYCLING

Divert organic waste (such as green and food waste) from landfills is to help reduce methane emissions and our impact on climate change. As of October 1, 2022, customers should have received an organic waste and trash and recycling container(s) for their waste collection service. We encourage you to evaluate the waste you generate and use the organic waste cart provided by your waste hauler to ensure you have an accurate size for your needs, and possibly decrease your overall bill.

What is organic waste?

Organic waste includes food scraps, food-soiled paper products and vard or green waste.

Why is it important to keep organic waste out of

When organic waste is buried in a landfill and decomposes, it releases methane, a greenhouse gas contributing to climate change.

What are the benefits?

When organic waste is collected separately from trash, it can be kept out of landfills and processed to create useful products such as compost, renewable electricity and transportation fuel while reducing methane emissions into the atmosphere.

What do I have to do?

Residents must separate organic waste from regular trash and place it in the green cart.

Insights & Education Drive the Right Behavior


- WM Smart Truck® technology utilizes CBSM principles to change behavior
 - Direct Distribution & Personal Connection increases likelihood materials are read & key messages are acted upon
 - Residents with contaminated carts should be notified and provided clear education on how to address
 - Link provided so City & Customers can view footage of their service
- In pilot WM Smart Truck® programs, cart contamination was reduced from an average of 26% to 3-6%


